Axel Johannessen

Axel Theodor Johannessen (29 May 1849 – 2 March 1926) was a Norwegian physician, pediatrician, professor at <u>University</u> of Oslo and senior doctor at <u>Rikshospitalet</u> Hospital in Oslo. ^[1]

Background

He was born in <u>Christiania</u> (now Oslo), Norway. He was the son of Christen Johannessen (1814-1903) and Christine Oline Thorkildsen (1820-1915). He graduated artium in 1866. He was a student at the Royal Frederick University (now University of Oslo) and became a <u>cand.med.</u> in 1875. He followed with a study trip to <u>Germany</u>, <u>Austria</u> and <u>Italy</u> to study <u>infectious diseases</u> based on the new subject of <u>bacteriology</u>.

Career

In 1876 Johannessen moved to <u>Bærum</u>, where he worked as a doctor at <u>Bærums Verk</u>. During 1885-1886, Johannessen studied the occurrence of <u>struma</u> and two years later undertook a trip to hospitals in <u>Germany</u>, the <u>Netherlands</u>, <u>Belgium</u>, <u>France</u> and <u>Denmark</u> to study the treatment of <u>tuberculosis</u>. ^[2]

In 1891 Johannessen was appointed lecturer in childhood diseases at the University of Kristiania. From 1893 he was also a senior doctor at <u>Rikshospitalet</u>'s newly established children's department, and in 1895 he was appointed as a professor in childhood diseases. He was one of the first pediatricians in Norway and founded the discipline of pediatrics at the university. He also founded the <u>Norwegian Society of Pediatricians</u> and served as its President until 1922. ^[3]

Personal life

In 1876, he married Lina Vedastine Malthe (1849-1926) who was the sister of surgeon Alexander Malthe.

Axel Johannessen was awarded the Crown Prince's Gold Metal (*Kronprinsens gullmedalje*) by the University of Oslo in 1882. He received the Order of St. Olav (Knight First Class) in 1907.^[4]
