Biography

Jakob von Sterneck was an Austrian botanist and entomologist. Born in Prague (then part of the Austrian Empire),

he studied botany at the city university from 1886 with Richard Wettstein. In 1922 he would give his herbarium of 25,000 plants to the university. He was an authority on the genus *Alectorolophus*, on which he published a monograph in 1901.

Von Sterneck's attentions turned to entomology from 1904, especially the Lepidoptera. He made a number of natural history collecting expeditions, notably to Greece (1910), and was a respected member of the Vienna Entomological Society.

While his lifelong passion was for natural history, von Sterneck maintained official positions in German Bohemia until his retirement in 1922, serving as district commissioner in Eger, Trautenau and Drahowitz.
