Menschen auf der ganzen Welt haben einen gemeinsamen Traum: das Bedürfnis nach Zuflucht in der Umwelt, die uns die kostbare Mutter Erde bietet. 90 % der Menschen auf diesem Planeten verbringen den Großteil ihres Lebens im urbanen Bereich, wo sie mitunter mit unbekannten Krankheiten oder geistiger Desorientierung konfrontiert sind, die immer weniger Ärzte die einzelnen Symptome diagnostizieren können. Manche Ärzte greifen auf holistische Pflanzenmedizinen zurück, die heute noch von indianischen Medizinmännern benutzt werden. Oft genug sind in der heutigen Zeit viele Menschen in regelmäßiger Behandlung bei Psychoanalytikern und Psychiatern, die mitunter

an den gleichen Symptomen leiden wie ihre Patienten: einem sehnsgütigen Hunger nach den Schönheiten der Mutter Natur und nach einer positiven und friedensliebenden Welt.

Wie können wir die Situation von „Speed“ und „Stress“, die so gut wie Teil unseres täglichen Lebens geworden sind, in Griff bekommen? Es ist nicht leicht, aber nicht unmöglich. Wir können keine Frieden anbieten oder fördern, solange wir keinen Frieden in uns selbst haben. Nur wenn wir völlig bewusst die Machart von guter, ehrbarer und bewusster Weltführung verstehen, können wir hoffen die Zerstörung der Mutter Natur aufzuhalten. Unsere Kinder könnten eines Tages eine Führungsposition einnehmen. Die Zukunft hängt von ihnen ab. Es liegt an uns ihnen die Bereitschaft einzugeben, um Mutter Erde und ihre empfindliche Umwelt zu verstehen, sowie die Bedürfnisse der Mitmenschen, mit vollem Respekt für Menschen aller Hautfarben und Bekenntnisse.



He travelled to most parts of Mother Earth with religious and spiritual leaders from all over the world, delivering his compelling words to millions of people.

He has been honoured by being chosen as one of the spiritual leaders to conduct a Blessing Ceremony at the NY United Nations and in Asia. His voice has been heard, on behalf of peace, in Washington, in front of the White House, before an audience of 1.5 million, and via Satellite television to viewers all over the world. He has lectured throughout the USA and Europe, including: Stanford University, California, the United Nations, (in NYC and Austria) and at the Labor Department in Washington, D. C.

As Ambassador for Peace, he has carried the words of the Native American Spirit to children of all ages: to young professionals, teachers, professors as well as people in the higher echelons of Government.

A plea which he makes in most of his seminars is: more communication, understanding, respect and love between fathers and mothers.
