HERRMANN, E.: Eine neue Dahlica (=Solenobia auct.) aus Südostfrankreich  
(Lepidoptera, Psychidae) pp. 5 - 11

In the present work, a new species of the Genus Dahlica ENDERLEIN, 1912 (= Solenobia DUP., 1842) from SE-France is described.

SCHINTLMEISTER, A.: Saisondimorphismus im Genitalapparat bei Spatalia HÜBNER,  
1819/1816 (Lepidoptera: Notodontidae). pp. 12 - 15

For the first time saisondimorphism in male genitalia in Lepidoptera is recorded. The far eastern Spatalia doerrisi GRAESER, 1888 and its western palae-arctic sister-species Sp. argentina DENIS & SCHIFFERMÜLLER, 1775, which externally differs somewhat between the two generations, shows in length of harpe striking differences. Also in the Japanese Sp. jezoensis WILEMAN & SOUTH, 1916 and in Sp. dives OBERTHÜR, 1884 such saisondimorphism was found.

In fact of this, differences in genitalia obtained from single specimens must not overrate.

At least the saisondimorphism in Spatalia can be seen as an argument for the monophylie of this group.

HACKER, H.: Weiterer Beitrag zur Verbreitung von Noctua fimbriata (Schreber,  
1759 und Noctua tirrenica Biebinger, Speidel & Hanigk, 1983 im Mittelmeerraum  
(Lepidoptera, Noctuidae). pp. 16 - 20

The report deals with the distribution of Noctua fimbriata Schr. and Noctua tirrenica B.,S. & H. in the mediterranean countries.

New captures are enumerated, among them Noctua tirrenica B.,S. & H. found for the first time in Yugoslavia and Turkey, Noctua fimbriata Schr. new to the fauna of Greece.

WUNDERLICH, J.: Zu Taxonomie und Determination europäischer Spinnen-Gattungen.  
1. Wolfspinnen (Lycosidae) (Arachnidae: Araneae). pp. 20 - 29

Abstract: The European genera of the family Lycosidae sensu ROEWER (1954, 1958, 1959) are revised. Synonymy: Acantholycosa DAHL, 1908 = Pardosa C.L. KOCH, 1848, Citilycosa ROEWER, 1954 = Lycosa LATREILLE, 1804 (n.syn.); Tricosta ROEWER, 1954 and Bonacosa ROEWER, 1954 = Arctosa C.L. Koch, 1848 (n. syn.), Tricca SIMON, 1888 is also regarded as junior synonym of Arctosa, Trochosula ROEWER, 1954 is perhaps synonym with Arctosa; Megarctosa CAPORACCO, 1948 is perhaps synonym with Lycosa. A simple key for the 12 genera of European Lycosidae is given.
