Dear Trichopterologist,

This Newsletter comes later than expected because of the lack of manuscripts. However, it is now hoped that it can be issued twice a year, following the decision to include literature references.

The reference journals in general use are far from complete. For compiling Trichoptera literature it is proposed that every reference which comes to my knowledge will be noted in the Newsletter, arranged according to the year of publi= cation and alphabetically under the authors' names. Any reader who knows of a publication not in the list is asked to send a reprint or at least the reference to me, so that it can be included in the next issue. It is thus hoped, with a minimum expense of time and money, to get a much more complete literature survey than in existing journals. This number starts with 1975: other years will be added later.

This number contains the reports of two meetings, other information and additions to the list of workers on Trichoptera. Please note also the announcement of a small regional meeting in Bavaria.

During the last few months the following important new books have been issued: A TAXONOMIC AND ZOOGEOGRAPHIC STUDY OF TASMANIAN CADDIS-FLIES by A.Neboiss (Mem.Nat.Mus. Victoria 38, 208 pp., 3 pls.) and LARVAE OF THE NORTH AMERICAN CADDISFLY GENERA by Glenn B.Wiggins (University of Toronto Press, Toronto and Buffalo, 401 pp.).

In May and June of this year I continued my field studies on Mediterranean mountain streams by visiting Crete and the four larger Ionian Islands. In September I had the opportunity to work at the Zoological Institute in Lenin= grad and to see the large collection there which was built up by A.V.Martynov and continued by S.G.Lepniova. This collection is in perfect order thanks to the care of L.A. Zhiltzova and her assistant, Mrs. Tetjujeva. Mrs.Zhiltzova also enabled me to see the collection of Fedtschenko which is the property of the Zoological Institute of Moscow University. This small but important collection is in relatively good condition. Several nomenclatorial changes may result from this study.

Please do not hesitate to send me short manuscripts for the Newsletter about anything that could be of interest to other Trichopterologists.
