
A propos Psilopteryx psorosa Kol. in the North Carpathians


Psilopteryx psorosa psorosa Kol., not based on Kolenati's type, but on original material and differing from that by SCHMID (1952). The authors recorded the subspecies as living in the Sudety Mountains and the North Carpathians.

Study of my material, collected in the North Carpathians, shows that specimens from the West Beskids look like P.psorosa bohemosaxonica Mey & Bots. (Figs.1-4), while those from the Tatra Mountains resemble P.psorosa psorosa Kol. (Figs.5-11), Nevertheless, amongst the Tatrian population only 1,8% (of 292 males) of the specimens were close to the version of the subspecies by Mey & Botosaneanu (Fig.5) and 12% (Fig.8) to the version by SCHMID (1952). The most common

Conclusions: Mey & Botosaneanu's description of P.psorosa psorosa is not really satisfactory; recently created subspecies of Psilopteryx should be checked with special (serological?) methods.

Finally it should be noted that P.psorosa carpathica Schmid does not live in the North Carpathians, as was recorded in my 1986 paper.
