SYRPH THE NET: the database of European Syrphidae (Diptera)

The Syrph the Net database comprises a set of text files and spreadsheets, subdivided into a series of "volumes". The volumes cover the following topics:

- vol. 1 – accounts of the species with bibliographic references (text)
- vol. 2 – habitat associations of the species (text/spreadsheets)
- vol. 3 – microhabitat associations of the species (text/spreadsheets)
- vol. 4 – biological traits of the species (text/spreadsheets)
- vol. 5 – range of the species and their status in various parts of Europe (text/spreadsheets)
- vol.6 — examples of the use of the database (text/spreadsheets)

The 1st. published edition of the database treats the species known from the Atlantic zone of Europe. A revision of that 1st. edition will be available early in 1998. That revision is a corrected, expanded and up-dated version, now covering more than 400 species. Coverage includes all of the species known from Ireland, Britain, Denmark, the Netherlands, Belgium and Luxembourg. The syrphid species known from northern Germany (Bremen, Niedersachsen and Schleswig-Holstein), and Atlantic parts of France, Spain and Portugal are also included. Habitat coverage relates to the same geographic area, excepting localised Iberian habitats, and in the revised version is extended to include certain sub-alpine habitats. The text files are in MS Word 6 and the spreadsheets are in MS Excel 3. Users require the appropriate Microsoft software for either IBM or Mac machines. Use of the spreadsheets for analytical purposes requires an understanding of Excel, which is not provided by the database. The database takes up c.3Mgb of disc space.

The database has been put together as a co-operative effort by European syrphid specialists. Syrphid workers who receive it are requested to help in improving its accuracy and coverage. The database has been set up not only to aid syrphid workers, but also to make knowledge of European syrphids as widely available as possible and to provide a mechanism for employing syrphids in environmental evaluation/interpretation studies, such as environmental impact surveys.

The database is available free of charge. It can be sent to prospective users either by e-mail or on discette. Potential users are required to sign and return a standard agreement before receiving the database files. The agreement may be obtained by e-mail, at speightm@indigo.ie or by post from

The 1998 version of the database has been completed and is now available. Work has commenced on the 1999 version, the coverage provided by the database will be expanded to include the following species:

Es ist geplant, anhand der Erfassung von Totholzhabitaten und durch Malaise-fallen-, Farbschalen- und Handfänge das potentielle und aktuelle Artenspektrum der Syrphidae in Auen zu erfassen. Durch Verschneidung der Daten soll ein Indikationsmodell für Auenökosysteme entworfen werden.

1. Totholz
2. Saftflüsse
3. Baumhöhlen
4. faulende Wurzeln (!!)
