June 27th, 1894. - 1) Description of five new Fishes from the Australasian Region. By J. Douglas Ogilby (Communicated by Edgar R. Waite, F.L.S.). Of the species described, Gillichthys mirabilis and Clinus Whiteleggei are from the coast of New South Wales, Ophioclinus De-Visi from Queensland, Petroscirtes Jcelii from Lord Howe Island, and Eleotris Huttoni from New Zealand. — 2) The Land Molluscan Fauna of British New Guinea. Second Supplement, continued from Vol. VI. p. 695. By C. Hedley, F.L.S. Two new species, Sitala anthropophagorum and Otopoma Macgregoriae, are described and figured. It is considered that Mousson's genus Trochonanina should be merged into Sitala. Anatomical details of several species not before dissected are added. — 3) Studies in Australian Entomology. No. VII. — New Genera and Species of Carabidae (including some Notes on previously described Species and Synoptic Lists of Genera and Species). By Thomas G. Sloane. Three genera — Notolestus (type, Abax sulcipennis, Macl.), Setalimorpha (Feronini), and Lestianthus (Helluonini) - and thirtysix species are described as new. — 4) Wood Moths: with some account of their life-histories, chiefly compiled from the Notes of Mr. R. Thornton of Newcastle. By W. W. Froggatt. This paper gives a general account of the habits and food-plants of several species of Eudoxyla and Charagia, and of Leto Stacyi. — 5) and 6) Botanical. Mr. Hedley exhibited figures of Listia tasmanica, Tenison-Woods; and the shelly tubes of Kuphus arenarius, Linn., collected by Mr. Brazier on a coral reef at Florida Island, Solomon Islands. In regard to Kuphus, he pointed out what little was on record concerning it; and visitors to the Solomons were urged to endeavour to procure the animal — unknown at present — which fabricates the tubes, as its affinities were somewhat problematical. Mr. Hedley also stated that he had been informed by a conchologist residing in New Zealand that Patella kermadecensis, Pilsb., had been collected at Raoul or Sunday Island by Captain Fairchild and party.
